



Drought Assistance

NSW Farmers has published a Briefing Note outlining Drought Assistance. State and Federal initiatives are listed at: https://www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/__data/assets/pdf_file/0020/800444/ Available-drought-assistance-innsw.pdf

The NSW State assistance comes under 8 headings:

- Farm Innovation Fund providing loans of up to \$250K over up to 20 years for a broad range of infrastructure to address long term farming risk.
- Transport for Donated Fodder
- Animal Welfare Transport
 Subsidy provides for up to 50% of eligible costs for permanent transport off a farm facing

- financial hardship.
- Drought Transport Fund provides low interest loans of up to \$20k to cover 100% of costs to transport stock, water or fodder to/from drought affected properties.
- Farm Business Skills DevelopmentProgram
- Farm Debt Mediation give a structured negotiation process with an accredited, independent mediator to help farmers and their creditors reach agreements about farm business debt.
- Rural Resilience Program
- Drought Feed Calculator is a mobile app to aid farmers make economical feed requirement

calculations.

Drought Transport Fund provides Federal measures now in place are:

- Farm Household Allowance
- Drought Assistance Concessional Loans
- Business Improvement Concessional Loans
- Farm Management Deposits
- Rural Financial Counselling
 Service works with farmers to

The Inland Rail proposed route through Gilgandra Shire, as designated by ARTC, has raised the ire of a cross section of our shire community, and rightly so. Outcomes however are ultimately matters for those with jurisdiction and decision making powers, and that is the Federal Government. That does not detract from Gilgandra Shire Council listening to community concerns, promoting and lobbying on behalf of the whole of our Shire's competing interests which has been undertaken, led by our Mayor and General Manager.

Take a moment to read the report in 15 May 2018 Council Business Paper pages 2- 8 plus attachments. That position needs to be recognised and respected.
