We all loved being involved in the 106th Tooraweenah Show and a big 'Congratulations' and 'thank you' to the Show Committee for putting on such a fabulous event!

We started preparing for the Show at the end of last term, as we had been experimenting with a 'new' painting technique, by 'scraping' the paint across the paper using different things, making patterns and colours. We did this on our art canvas and when we came back this term, we thought about something special we could draw on them, using our black markers. These canvas artworks were displayed along with some amazing art and craft at the Tooraweenah Show on October 15th in the Pavilion.



Preschool friends made the most of the wet weather and being indoors, spending a great deal of time working on some

Hints From The Dog House with Brendan Butler

The last two months have been busy at Oakfield kelpies with the latest litter of puppies to look after. to chase uncontrollably, which co indicate that they are strong and courageous but mightn't be the

With the puppies that were born in June its been a matter of keeping them and their mother shiny and healthy, at six weeks they were weaned and at eight weeks got their

first vaccination and are registered with the Kelpie council.

At around that time my practice is to show the whole litter of pups to some quiet sheep in the yards to gauge there response on stock. I find this is a good indicator of their style, temperament and courage as they are just going on their natural instinct. we can lock those traits away in the memory bank for later when they a seven to eight months old and star get some proper training on stock. In the mean time, while they are getting to that age they can be taughted.

This is always a fascinating time as you might find one with natural urge to curve around to the head and hopefully walk at the sheep, which is what I'm looking for, as this indicates to me that they could be quite smart and have strength or they might want to chase uncontrollably, which could indicate that they are strong and courageous but mightn't be the sharpest tool in the shed or there might be one or more that are unsure of the situation and quite timid, and would indicate that some care will be needed in future to build confidence.

What ever their preferences are it usually comes to the fore with this first couple of looks at the stock and we can lock those traits away in the memory bank for later when they are seven to eight months old and start to get some proper training on stock. In the mean time, while they are getting to that age they can be taught their name, to come when called, to lead and be tied up, to sit and have general good manners when feeding etc and just used to plenty of interaction with their new owner.

I personally don't give them much training on stock until they are older and strong enough to have some control over and then only in short bursts to keep them keen and going ahead.






