for their time, effort and patience.



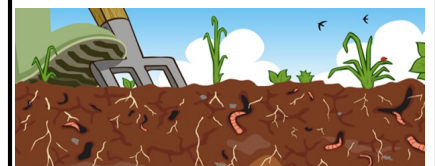

Tooraweenah Show - Pasture Field Day and Fundraiser 9th September

The Tooraweenah Show society would like to invite all forward thinking producers to a pasture field day to be held at Tooraweenah on Friday the 9th of September.

The day is being put on as a fund raiser for the Tooraweenah Show Society at a cost of \$40 per head including a Lions club lunch. Any students will be free. The day will start with registration at the Toora Show ground at 8.30am then an introduction from the days MC Mr Dave Harbison, an agronomist, pasture consultant and past president of the NSW Grasslands Assoc.

We will then proceed a short distance out of town to inspect an improved light soil tropical grass stand with emphasis on establishing and maintaining legumes as well as the establishment and management of the grass.

Well known central west agronomist Mr Bob Freebairn will take us over the management must dos of native and tropical grass and the importance of a strong legume component to get the best out of our different land types and pastures.

Bob will draw on his 40 years of experience, of trials and farming on light soils around the central west, and will be supported by Dr Belinda Hackney a senior DPI legume breeder and researcher who has knowledge of all things nitrogen.

Dr Hackney has done extensive trialing on hard seeded legumes in NSW, testing their suitability to different areas and also their ability to fix nitrogen .

Next stop will be onto a heavy loam site with more of the same but with an emphasis this time on what's happening under the ground, carbon and its effects

on the soil and hopefully just demystifying some of the many questions that surround this complex topic.

At this site we have Dr Susan Orgill (a former DPI soil scientist and researcher) who's specialty and passion is soils. She will talk us through this interesting topic and no doubt will have her trusty spade with her to show as well as tell us about soil carbon. This issue is becoming more important in agriculture and Susan has an easy and entertaining way of explaining and simplifying what to many is the carbon puzzle.

After a lunch break we will continue on to a third site on some strong country, where the Bowman family setup a trial plot last year to compare some interesting and different species including radishes, turnip, winter grasses and all the above in different mixes, different newer Lucerne varieties as well as different sowing rates, various clovers, medics and legumes and comparing different fodder crops of wheat, oats and barley.

This trial was set out by Agronomist Mr Jack Edwards of W@S seeds and Jack will be on hand to take us through the plots and comment on their results.

Kevin Watling from The Castlereagh, Macquarie County Council weeds department will also be on hand to discuss woody weed problems .

The day will conclude in time to allow people to catch buses etc. and get home at a decent hour.

We know this will be an interesting and informative day for not only farmers, but also our future Ag leaders as the calibre of the presenters will be those at the top of their field.

All animal producers and Ag minded students should get a great insight into how we can make our soil and pastures more productive and this is surely an important and underrated topic in the central west of NSW.

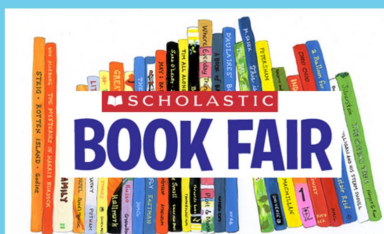

Hints From the Dog House—With Brendan Butler

We all love our beloved pet dogs but one of the most annoying features of having a house or working dog is having to put up with them barking at annoying times, eg the middle of the night. Constant barking can usually be put down to frustration and boredom from being locked up or chained for too long and distraction from what's going on around them. If one dog starts barking at a stray cat wandering past it can set off a chain reaction of other dogs joining in the mayhem. Obviously if we have a dog that is a constant barker we need to look at what is setting it off. It usually just

needs more stimulation and exercise during the day and be taught to stop barking on command and for this we can use reverse psychology. At most working dog schools we are shown drills to teach a dog to bark on command because this is a useful tool for when we might need a bark in a working situation. To get a dog to bark we gee them up with excited tones and upwards hand gestures then do the opposite to stop them using a strong sharp short tone of voice or in my case a sharp whistle and stand over body language to get them to stop. We can then use that voice command or whistle

at other times when barking is not tolerated. This drill can be used in a domestic situation as well by geeing your dog up of a morning when it is excited to see you then making it stop with a hand gesture and voice command before letting it off. If done regularly and repetitively this might save the more drastic measures of going out in the freezing cold and cracking a whip or yelling obscenities to get them to stop!
