

Councillors Corner - Cr Mockler Reports



Council's (GSC) extended term of 5 years has concluded, and electors will now choose their next

term, community advocates and representatives.

May I recommend taking the time to look at GSC website and the 2016/21 End of Term Report. It is a comprehensive report and highlights the multitude of achievements which deserve acknowledgement and recognition.

The totality of community outcomes have been significant. As the Mayor Doug Batten reports, Council has managed to return sound financial results which is an OLG requirement, with Council investing \$41.8M in capital works and with a record \$11.5M delivered in 2020/2021. GSC is a proactive Council, notwithstanding criticisms and

complaints, and this is illustrated in the comprehensive report. Some examples of Council initiated projects include, 12 days of Xmas, The Gil Collective, Shop Local Campaign, A night under the Gums, Big Ideas Program, Signage, Gil Library Hub, CBD activation development, Winter Wonderland, Cooee Heritage Centre upgrade, McGrane Oval lights, new fence and upgraded player amenities and

Gilgandra Shire facilities, plans for the exciting new **Hunter Park Sports and Recreational** Precinct, completion of the New Works Depot, (project cost \$4.2M), installation of a new bore water supply at Tooraweenah, rural bridges replacements, (only 2 wooden structure bridges left), traineeships and Inland Rail project.

> Successful Council managed grant funding applications have been crucial to community infrastructure improvements and economic development.

Skilled to qualified program has been a great initiative which supported 23 locals into employment ready positions with Inland Rail.

Nineteen (19) employees have been involved in traineeships and apprenticeships with Council to the end of September 2021.

GSC is the largest employer with over 230 employees in a range of community sectors.

Council has recently received notification of Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 4 funding of \$776.383. More will be reported on this project.



Recent community engagement responses emphasise the ongoing importance of Councils roads network, particularly rural, and this is likely to be central to the incoming **Councils Community Strategic Plan** and its delivery to the community through Councils Operational Plan.

Electors now have the opportunity to select 9 out of 11 candidates to represent them , listen to issues, consult with the community and achieve meaningful outcomes as Councillors in the interests of shire ratepayers and residents.

Hints From The Dog House! With Brendan Butler



the highly trained dog had to start with learning its name, getting it to come, sit, walk calmly on a leash and

With very young dogs, food, along with affection and repetition is one of the best bribes for getting them to do as we ask for things like learning their name and getting them to sit and stay. As they mature we can use the dogs natural instincts to train them. Such as a work dogs instinct is to want to herd its prey to its pack leader, in this case us. We can use this herding instinct to train them to

cast to the stock, to go left or right around them or get over their backs to force them into a tight space. Getting the pet Labrador to chase a tennis ball or fetch your slippers is using its instincts to chase, gather and bring back to the pack leader and the sniffer dog is using its keen sense of smell to find something to bring to its master. When starting a work dog pup we want to see its natural instinct to want to go around the stock and bring them to us, which is why it is important to start them on a few quiet sheep, in a small confined yard and keep tight control on them so we can then build on this and not start their work life out in the paddock, where they will only want to chase every thing that moves. Tooraweenah Preschool 'Developing Wings of Independence' - With Miss Marie



Preschool friends have kept very busy with lots of amazing games and investigations, that have all been led by the children. We have had cubby houses and cars, and a special favourite is the shopping trip in the car where all the friends put on their 'best clothes' (from the dress ups) and take their babies with them as well as pack the cash register in the car (after all, they are going shopping and need cash!) and head off to the shops, after the 'mum' has made sure everyone is strapped in safe and sound. The 'mum' is also really clever at giving the 'dad' instructions on how to drive and where to park .

Another fun adventure game the children have made up has been driving to the vets, with the children using small puppets and making 'cages' for them (from the box construction items) so they travel safe in the car to the vets to get fixed and get better.



The cash register is also packed for this trip as it will again, cost money! The car is super amazing- it can expand another 2 or 3 seats as required so everyone fits in and has been driven over the most amazing terrain – from 'our mountains', through flooded rivers and even across paddocks that are being harvested, with 'mum' directing 'dad' to 'watch out for the mother bin!'

These preschool friends have also kept busy doing lots of investigating and research. They have been using their fabulous auditory skills and identifying animal sounds, and some other common items by sound, with the listening post. First, as a large group listening carefully before enjoying the experience on the

listening post and using the headphones. Some of the animal sounds challenged us initially but now we know what a dove, cormorant, dolphin and whale sound like. The common sounds were easier, especially as we all know the sound that motorbikes and vacuum cleaners make! We videoed our production of "Stuck In The Mud" that we prepared for 'Grandparents Day' in August and placed it on our online platform, Educa. This was a lot of fun and very entertaining - especially when the grader drivers went to reverse to pull out the tractor and fell over in their giant grader box! Everyone enjoyed this 'show' and we all laughed and giggled. This fun has carried on outside where we now play with the large box green ute, red box tractor and the brown box grader. This child-led imaginative game has grown each day with lots of amazing adventures where tractors are bogged (like in our story) or roads are getting graded and fixed after the ute has driven across and found big potholes that need fixing! The playground has been a bustle of

activity everywhere: riding our bikes and scooters around – at speed for another fun child-led game; the sandpit has been a busy place with buried treasures, diggers, sandcastles and lots of cooking, painting with water, playing our fishing game at the bridge and in the river bed, with the fish moving to the café cubby house for fish and chips, as well as a lot of interest in and discussions about our veggie garden, the worm farm and also our plants and beautiful playground environment in general.

We have some new playground friends in the garden, both live ones (a blue tongue lizard has been seen and evidence of an echidna also) as well as some other statue friends.

Enrolment packages for 2022 went out in November: via Lester and Helen at the Toora PO. If you want an enrolment package and did not get one please ring me at preschool (6848 1060) and arrange this. We look forward to seeing our returning Preschoolers and also meeting new preschool friends and families in the year ahead.

We have been very busy preparing our story "Come To My Party" for our Party in the Park that is being held soon. Each child has a special part to play and have made some amazing concert crowns to go with their character – we look fabulous! Children have also selected their favourite songs to sing. We are hoping Santa might hear us as he flies around before Christmas checking up on everyone, and if he does,

maybe, just maybe, he might be able to pop in and say hello? We are creating a special picture each to go in our Story book for Santa as he is always so busy giving presents away, we want to give one to him too! (See Photo front page)

We have some busy few weeks ahead as we count down to Christmas and the end of our preschool year.

Lots of exciting Christmas crafts and activities have been discussed and planned with an amazing Advent Calendar of special activities, with children also continuing with other child-led investigations throughout our room. I would like to extend a sincere and very BIG THANK YOU to the wider Tooraweenah Community for their constant and unwavering support of Tooraweenah Preschool. We are so very grateful to everyone: individuals, businesses, Tooraweenah Public School and our families and children. We have had a terrific year at Tooraweenah Preschool with our preschool friends, and everyone being so involved in so much learning, exploring, investigating, discovering, creating, designing and adventures in general. A big thank you to our Management Committee and families for all that you do for Tooraweenah Preschool. 
