



Tooraweenah Showground NSW Government Crown Reserves Improvement Fund Successful Application \$344,358



Tooraweenah Committee were excited to hear the news that they had been successful in a grant application for new toilet amenities to the value of \$344,358.

The funding will be used to install 4 standard toilets, 1 disability toilet, 1 storage room and 4 showers.

The committee has teamed with Lyons Advantage from Dubbo to project manage the construction and ensure all building regulations and engineering specs are adhered too. Currently we are working with Barnson's Engineering and Gilgandra Shire Council to submit the DA.

This grant follows from \$180,000 received last year through the Building Stronger Communities Round 4 to knock and rebuild the block opposite the pavilion with 1 standard toilet and 1 disability toilet. The existing portable toilets will remain onsite.

A new modern amenity block will be a great asset to Tooraweenah Showground for visitors, patrons and locals!

The Gilgandra Film Festival will be held at the Gilgandra Shire Hall on Saturday 22nd of April, commencing at 7pm.

Three Films will be featured.

Cost is \$25 per person including supper.

The three films are:

1. “Warrawong.....The Windy Place on the Hill showcases the beauty of the local area of the Warrumbungles, country life, resilience of farmers



and highlights country towns such as Tooraweenah and Gilgandra. Documented over 18 months, film maker Simon Target highlights floods, drought, mouse plagues and COVID restrictions on farm life, as well as the CWA and the role it plays in rural areas.

2. “The Dream Life of Georgie Stone” - spanning 19 years—reveals the memories of Georgie Stone, a transgender teen as she helps to change laws, affirms her gender, finds her voice, and emerges into adulthood. This short film gives much food for thought.
3. “Masha and Valentyne” was filmed in Poland and Ukraine last year and shows the escape of two women and their children from the war between Russia and Ukraine and from a stable family life to refugees in Poland. This is very much today’s news and an insight into the difficulties of war.

It has been very exciting to be back at preschool with 12 very excited returning and new friends so far this year. We have all enjoyed spending time together, making friends, catching up and doing craft. We have also been doing lots of team work with some amazing projects, working together with Miss Marie and Miss Shannon. We have had a flying start to the preschool year, that's for sure!

Miss Shannon brought in her incubator and we learnt all about how eggs hatch this



way. We are excited about being Mums and Dads to these chickens when they hatch. Miss Shannon showed us how to place them carefully in their cradle, and we marked the days on the calendar. This has been helpful, as

some friends are super excited about the chickens coming, there was even some disappointment that they didn't hatch that afternoon! Miss Shannon has 'candled' the eggs so we could see how they are growing inside, and we even saw the chicken moving! Miss Shannon has been bringing in some of her chooks to have fun at preschool. This led to a big investigation and lots of discussions about animals that hatch from eggs, especially after reading the story 'Chicken's Aren't The Only Ones'. We are enjoying discovering more and more animals that hatch from eggs, and this has led us on a very interesting learning journey.

On recent hot days we have enjoyed

blowing bubbles and playing in the water trough: we've placed some ice in the water that has colour in it. As it's melted, the colour has merged with the water. This has fascinated our friends as they can see their hands 'change colour' as they immerse them in the water. It's also been fun pouring and measuring with our scoops and small containers as part of our play.

Outside projects have included the Yarning Circle, more sand in the dry riverbed, creating new gardens, and planting out hanging pots for our railing and a bubbler garden to make our entrance area more welcoming and inviting.

We all worked together to move sand with our wheelbarrows from the school yard to our 'Yarning Circle', making sure we tipped it on top of the weed mat and under the shade cloth shelter. It was very exciting to open the big box with our fire pit in it: we have some wood there to put in it but have also used it for a duck pond and other imaginative play.

The box was also heaps of fun for the rest



of the day, with it being a pirate ship, a Jack-In-The-Box, a cubby, and a possum's hide-hole. We are planning to get some 'stump' seating for this area and some hanging garden ornaments to really give it some character.

We've threaded some colourful wind



chimes with **helpers Ally & Sophie**, using recycled items such as lids and straws, adding some beads, bells and other interesting things and hanging them on small sticks. We've even made several

more for preschool, tying them up to a very long stick from Miss Marie's garden, which is now hanging up under the shelter in the Yarning Circle, looking fabulous! We can hear the bells on these ringing when the wind blows. They are so amazing – we've even had a request from a Nan for one at her house!

While we were working with our wheelbarrows and getting sand, we placed sand in our dry riverbed to stop the rocks wobbling too much. We've been doing a lot of digging as we are creating garden beds on either side of our wooden walkway bridge. This has been a big job – but it is now ready to plant out and together we have some great ideas for these spaces.

Our next project is to beautify our entrance area, with our new hanging baskets to go along the railing, making a "bubbler garden" along the wall and finish off this area with some fun garden hangers and ornaments to complement our hanging flower and herb gardens. Inside our friends have been busy building with the 'magna-tiles' and using them to build houses and shelters for the farm animals and sheds for the farm vehicles. We have had tall towers as well as very big 'paddock' like structures on the mat. The children's imaginations have been amazing.

We've had a very busy café on site that takes lots of take-away orders, and we have loved play dough, painting and creating at the busy table, as well as singing and dancing together, with both the piano and our dance CD's. It sure is great to be back at Tooraweenah Preschool!

Our Pub BBQ's for February have been a great success and we thank everyone for their contribution and assistance with this. Thank you to all of our volunteer cooks and helpers at the BBQ and a special thank you to our Tooraweenah community for your support and patronage. We really are very grateful to everyone and realise just how fortunate we are to live in such a wonderful community. Thank you all.

Our Annual General Meeting is to be held on Tuesday 4th April (pending all financials are back) in the school classroom next to preschool. Best Start

Mrs Smith has completed the Best Start Assessment with each of our Kindergarten students to get to know more about where they are starting their school learning journey. Students completed activities in literacy and numeracy 1:1 with their teacher and information collected has been provided to parents.

STEPS to Success

Our STEPs to Success project is in its final year, of a three-year funding program and is set to leave a lasting legacy at our school.

The STEPs to Success project aims to give teachers, students and parents a shared understanding of how students best learn at school through explicit direct instruction (EDI) and how this approach can build student's confidence and accelerate their results.

Key to our project, is implementing synthetic phonics instruction and using daily warm-ups in reading, spelling, writing and mathematics to continue to revise content and skills beyond their exposure in explicit lessons. This helps to move student understandings from their short-term to their long-term memory.

Each week, in the newsletter we will be sharing information about our project and providing opportunities throughout the year for parents to learn more about these techniques and how they can support their child's learning in partnership with the school.

I would like to encourage parents and extended families to talk to their child and children, about what they are learning at school. We love to ignite the spark for learning and believe families and schools can work together to promote a love of learning.

Recently, as part of STEPs to Success, Mr John Fleming, our Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI) coach mentor, delivered a professional learning session and supplied new resources to support us in our Explicit Direct Instruction.







Arthur Butler Aviation Museum News



President of the Aviation Museum association, Mark Pitts, is pleased to tell you that, as a result of the work of association members, more and more aircraft are visiting the aerodrome.

At the moment these seem to be exploratory visits, like the first bees to a newly blossoming flowerbed. Some of these visits are momentary as the pilots test the condition of the runway, but others result in visits to the *Mountain View* for lunch. Whichever type of visit it is, the pilots are taking back positive reports to their colleagues, which will attract other pilots and hopefully have them stay a bit longer to enjoy the beauty of the area.

This increase has been noted by Council. As a result, Council has shown a commitment to maintaining the aerodrome to the best standard possible.

This commitment can be strengthened through residents telling their local Council representative that they support the Council's work on the aerodrome.

The time has passed for bringing in the sheaves, so now the need is for workers in the vineyard.

The organisers of the *Winging it Down the Castlereagh* air rally and village fair planned for Saturday, 20th May 2023 are looking for the support of the people of Tooraweenah to make this event a success for the community, not just the Museum.

The experience gained by the various community groups from organising the annual show, the various horse events, rural fire service, pre-school and boutique businesses is what the event organisers would like to borrow for this event.

If the community give the organisers support, the air rally will become a permanent fixture on the aviation calendar, as well as providing economic and business potential for the community.

Tooraweenah Wild Dog – Post Script

As a postscript to the previous article about a wild dog presence on Tooraweenah properties (Toorabungles, October 2022), a DNA sample of the dog was sent to the LLS who had it tested for its genetic make-up.

The results of the testing revealed that: The dog was a dingo-dominant crossbred (69% dingo genes), which means that it was not a first cross and was not a pure dingo, even though it was a yellow "dingo-like" dog.

At family level, it was unrelated to any

others within the dataset of more than 8,500 dogs recorded.

It was a member of the east coast and ranges sub-population, which roughly runs from about Nowra up to Bundaberg on the coast and up through Dubbo, Narrabri, Goondiwindi and Moonee to Eidsvold on the western side of its distribution. The nearest different sub-populations are in the northwest of the state (NSW) and in Central Queensland.

The more that is known about these

populations and how they are distributed through the regions, the more intelligently we can manage true dingo populations and the problematic crossbred feral populations. *Jan Robertson*
