



Hints From The Dog House! With Brendan Butler



One of the most rewarding and helpful jobs our trusty work dogs can do for us is to be able to be sent scurrying off nice and wide around a big mob of sheep or cattle, come in nice and calmly at the 12oclock position and pick the mob up and push them towards us.

Wether it be a 10 acre holding yard near the sheep yards or out in a timbered paddock a good cast and pickup is invaluable, and can save so much work and time.

But a lot of us would just ride the quad off around the stock with the dogs on the back and do the job ourselves because we can't trust the dog to get it right and a botched up cast will just cause more work and anger with the dog.

One of the most common stuff ups with casting is that the dog when sent to the stock will run straight towards them causing the stock to turn away and move or run away at right angles to the way we want them to come to us. A dog running towards the stock is even likely to come across in front of the mob and go to the wrong side which will cause

serious mayhem. This scenario is even more likely if you try to cast more than one dog to the stock even if they are usually reliable because they will tend to race each other and lose concentration on the job at hand.

When we first start a pup on a few sheep in a small yard, the first thing we try to get them to want to do is run off us and go and balance and hold the sheep to us, this is their natural herding instinct that we want to build on, so, when we let that pup go to go around those few trainer sheep that is their first cast, even if it is only a few metres.

Once we are getting the pup to take some commands like being able to stop and know to go back is to go anti clock wise and around is clock wise, we are effectively casting our pup. We build on this by putting more distance between where we start the pup and the stock so hopefully, by the time a young dog is 12 months old it would cast out a couple of

hundred metres and by 18 months cast around a 30 acre paddock.

A couple of ways to get a dog to cast wide of the stock is to sit the dog and get between the dog and the stock and when you cast the dog onto the sheep as it is coming towards you and the sheep you walk towards it and push it out with your body language and the command to" get out".

An easier way that I have found is to put a barrier between the dog and the sheep whether it be a tree or drum in the yard or in my case at home I make the dogs go around a shed to get behind the sheep and then make the dog stop and sit till the sheep start to move off them.

If working a big mob with more than one dog I would only ever cast one dog till it has control before letting another one go to keep things calm and calm is the key to good stock work.

Macquarie Group Conference is set for 25th October at Wongarbon pending COVID 19 restrictions.




