Pasture Field Day; Right Pastures, Right Country, Right Time!



Dave Harbison's take home message from the Pasture Field Day, " get the right pasture, in the right country, at the right time, promotes soil fertility, the key to successful production."

Brendan Butler reports; the Tooraweenah Show Society's pasture field day and fundraiser was successfully held on the 9th of September as planned.

The day dawned quite gloomy after 20 plus mm of rain the night before but cleared away to enable a crowd of 85 to attend an interesting and informative day and, have a day out away from the farm.

The days proceedings were chaired by Dave Harbison, a pasture consultant from Molong and past president of the NSW Grasslands Association. He kept the program rolling along smoothly and had some sound opinions and advice on the topics as they cropped up during the day.

Well known local agronomist Bob Freebairn gave an excellent presentation on getting the most out of our country and different soil types and had great advice in the paddock on the management and establishment of the grass and legumes we were looking at. Soil scientist and Soil Carbon expert Dr Susan

Orgill explained and showed the crowd the benefits of growing and keeping ground cover to keep our soil biology healthy and promote and retain the soil carbon that is generated from the breakdown of organic

After a hearty Lions Club lunch, the field day moved to the

Bowman families trial plot at Glen Iris, where Jack Edwards from Sand W Seeds walked us through the rows of different hard seeded clovers, medics, sub clovers, Lucerne, brassicas and temperate grasses plus, some different fodder crops of oats and winter wheat to rap up the day.

The Show Society would like to thank the Bowman family for sharing this interesting trial plot and it will be great to see how the trial changes, what persists and what fizzles out over the next few years.

Tooraweenah Show Society President Ben Gale said "I would also like to thank everyone for coming and supporting the day, the workers who helped make the day, the Lions Club for catering, the presenters for giving us there time and wisdom and the wonderful sponsors who's support will help the Show Grounds continued development."

Cunning, Elusive, Cruelly Destructive, Wild Dog! - By Jan Robertson



Rural media have detailed stories of wild dogs over recent years. The articles portray cunning, elusive and cruelly destructive predators which have sometimes remained at large for many years despite the best efforts of primary producers and highly trained professional trappers. We have always felt extremely lucky that our pest problems did not include wild dogs, until now.

The first sighting of this dog was this trail camera photo taken at the front gate of an established home with two dogs fenced not 10 metres from the tree in the photo. He was extremely brazen. After unusual signs on dead livestock prior to this photo, this was the unequivocal evidence that we had a new (to this property) problem. He went on to affect several properties and many people.

Over the four weeks until he was caught, he wrought carnage on two properties in particular, with 30 new lambs killed or maimed on one, and 20 on another.

Between these two events there were multiple small events. For some of us it was a steep learning curve. We were overwhelmed by the generosity of friends, neighbours and the LLS with their time, professional expertise and sustained effort over the month.

Traps, cameras and thermal viewing gear were loaned and purchased. There were many baits laid, and traps were set on three properties from one end of Windurong Road to the other. Surveillance trail cameras and hours of tracking established the dog's habits, haunts and the routes he took along the

properties from east to west. Heavy rain events caused changes and re-evaluations of his habits.

Many hours were spent treating the remaining wounded sheep and lambs, protecting sheep flocks, especially lambing ewes at night, and quietly sitting on the dog's night route hoping to be there at the right time to dispatch him. Nights of sleep were lost, and sensibilities challenged by the stock mutilation (not easy despite years of being on the land).

Biosecurity challenges are ever-changing and good seasons have allowed the bourgeoning of animal pests; foxes, pigs and now dogs.

Thank you to all who helped with the solution to this unfamiliar challenge. We are grateful for Lincoln's trap which ultimately caught the dog on 31 August 2022, but we are also extremely grateful for all the support and help we were freely offered by friends and neighbours, knowing when the problems come, the troops will rally. Thank you.

Transition to School




Our Transition students have settled in beautifully to school routines each Monday this term. They have shown a growing confidence in how 'big school' routines work and are impressing the


