Demolition of the old timber bridge is now complete with working platforms under construction. There is full closure of the bridge and approaches given the level of works involved, and we remind road users to please use alternative access. Project completion is set for the end of June 2021, weather permitting.

Business Improvement Grant (BIG Ideas program):





# Councillors Corner – Cr Brian Mockler Reports!



Lester Thurston has re-joined Tooraweenah Management Committee (TMC) Suffice to say he

caused havoc at his first meeting on the 24<sup>th</sup> February proving quite a handful for chairman Daryl Colwell, Council's Director of Infrastructure! A program of tree planting will be happening in the village, coordinated by TMC members.

Council's Capital Works program value for the current financial year is \$25m, total spent to 31 Dec was \$6.49m. Councillors' have set an ambitious target.

The new Works Depot is due for completion, a most welcome addition invested funds \$30.7m, New to facilities for Council's staff. Council has been allocated \$697k under their Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

In accordance with Program guidelines, Council resolved to allocate the funding to a combination of projects including \$220k reconstruction of Leeches Creek bitumen seal.

The Quarterly budget review to the 31st December 2020 projection, is an end of FY deficit, (excluding depreciation), of \$59k.

The Auditor advice to Council is that Council should aim for a balanced or surplus budget. This is an expectation in Local Government.

A bit of data from last Financial Year results is: Operating revenues, excluding capital grants and contributions \$32.464m, Operating expenses \$30.553m, Cash and borrowings \$3.623m, net assets \$334.5m. Auditor comment : Overall good result. Planning is now underway for next financial year.

# Hints From The Dog House! With Brendan Butler

Training a pup or immature young dog of a few months old can be rewarding if they are responding well to our drills, but can be frustrating when it's not going that well and the wheels fall off and they just want to run a muck. Last month we looked at starting with the basics and not letting the young dog and owner get ahead of themselves and trying to get to fancy. Getting cranky with a lunatic pup will only make it frightened of you and make the task of getting it



under control that much harder, so patience is the no1 key. Getting our pup calmly walking on a leash is a good first step to start. Keep the pup on a short leash to start with so we can put pressure on when they try to take off in front of you and when they start to settle beside you, relax your body language and liberally praise the pup in your higher pitched friendly voice. Once the pup is walking calmly we can get it to walk to heel or behind you, for this I use a plastic rake as an extension of our



arm for a blocker. Every time they want to move beside or in front of you we push them back with the command to get behind or heel. With repetition of this for a few days they quickly learn to happily walk just behind you. Next month we can look at getting the pup to stop, lay down and stay . Remember to be patient, don't get cranky and get down to their level and be liberal with praise and you will have a loyal friend, who just wants to please.

We have had a very busy start to our preschool year and enjoyed getting to know our new preschool friends and families.

Everyone has had a lot of fun getting to know each other through our many indoor and outdoor learning activities. The sandpit has been very popular and being creative at the easel and busy table have also been enjoyed.



In the holidays, our paving was completed around the new bridge. Special thanks to Cooper's Dad Paul (Lambell)

and his helpers Benn Jenkin and Matt Howard. The children have enjoyed utilising this area, with the bridge being the perfect fishing spot for our fishing game, or just a nice area to sit and catch your breath. We have also challenged ourselves with riding the bikes up and down the bridge, even trying out our prams and the fabulous new wheelbarrows along the path and up over the bridge too. The children were great building assistants when building the wheelbarrows together we even found the lost treasure - one of the bolts with the nuts on it. that was hidden in the sandpit, so we started searching like pirates! (There was no 'X marks the spot however, just together as a team to recognize the a lot of good fortune and some keen helpers looking for it and working well together, as a team!)

We have been talking about 'flying machines' and having fun creating and experimenting with different types of parachutes, even playing parachute games outside with our large parachute, as well as flying our model parachutes – they work well from our climbing equipment when there is not too much wind! They also work when we stand carefully on our step ladder for our experiment, allowing us to investigate even further.

each other across the carpet and seeing how good we are at being pilots. There have been some interesting and in-depth discussions about flying machines, what they can do, how they work, where they go and who has been on a plane.

Miss Sarah made preschool some very



special letters that the children have enjoyed playing with - lots of singing the

"ABC" alphabet song and working letters as we sing them.

We have enjoyed playing with the farm animals, building farms, creating some fabulous story lines, as well as fishing (both inside and outside).
