Hints From The Dog House with Brendan Butler — Body Language



When starting to train a working dog, one of the first drills we use is to get it to go around a small mob of a of couple of sheep and balance them to us.

At this early stage the dog hasn't learnt its working commands so we use our body language to guide the dog on where we want it to go. As we move around from left to right the dog hopefully, will mirror our movements around the stock and stay on balance on the other side of the sheep.

When moving around the yard we should always face the way we want the sheep to

go and stay side on to the dog, including gateways so the dog will pick up on our body language on where we want to end up. To get the dog to stop we step into its direct line facing up to it with a command to stop, as soon as we get a reaction we relax and praise the dog.

If we wanted the dog to go around the other way from right to left using our body language, we would step into its direct line to pull the dog up and move towards it with our left shoulder pointing towards the Contact Brendan Butler 0447 481 048. pressure point in front of the dog and make Happy Mustering. it want to turn around and go back to the point of balance. A garden rake is a great aid at this early stage as it is used as an extension of our arm to guide the dog around and used as a block up to make it stop.

A common mistake is to use the rake to push the dog back around, once having

blocked the dog if we are in the right position we should be able to guide the dog back with our body position.

This kit allows students to grow 30 plants in a 1 square metre space using hydroponics in each tower. The kit comes complete with liquid fertiliser and PH testing kits for students to

monitor the water quality as the plants grow. Digital microscopes and Microbits in the kit will allow students to investigate living things throughout the unit.

Students planted the first seeds that will be used with the kit and found out more about how Aeroponics works.


