"Winging It Down the Castlereagh!"

A well-attended town meeting this month, was presented with a plan for a community event the Arthur Butler Museum is planning, for May 20th 2023.

It is hoped, that an annual flying event will become part of the Tooraweenah Events Calendar alongside the Annual Show and Endurance Ride. And like those events, it will benefit the businesses and bring the people of Tooraweenah together.

So, how can you help?. There are three main areas where people are needed – the public areas, emergency response and the flying event itself. Each of these will be led by a coordinator who organises a team of people so everything runs smoothly. The SES will coordinate all things safety, from first aid to emergency response. The Museum will coordinate the flying event and a Public Areas Coordinator will need volunteer teams to help with parking and keeping people away from danger areas.

Several local businesses have indicated they will set up stalls displaying their wares or providing information about their activities. There will even be a colouring competition for the kids. The organising committee would welcome more stallholders, so the event has an atmosphere of a "village fair". Since it is an aviation event of significance, there will be lots of very interesting aeroplanes to see.

In other news, a representative of the Museum recently attended a Stakeholders Forum organised by the Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences at the Powerhouse Museum in Sydney. The overriding message was that local museums in Regional NSW are recognised as essential to the cultural and educational needs of their local areas, their Regions, the State, and the Nation.

For that reason, State and Federal Governments are backing local museums to the hilt, not only with cold cash, but with the support of experts in all matters from collecting and preserving items, to developing interesting displays and education programs. Those experts will advise museums on the steps needed to obtain the financial resources to access that cold cash.

As a result of attending the Forum, the museum now recognises that its role in the community is not simply to preserve the history of Arthur Butler and Butler Air Transport, but to include the history of the people of Tooraweenah. After all, without the Garling's, the Yeos and the other local families, Butler Air Transport would not have existed. *Happy landings! Captain Tailskid*

The fabulous Frances Evans, together with her colleague Kim Pearson have inspired our students through three days of "Toora Music Makers". The sessions focused on rhythm, pitch and learning about different instruments. Students even got to play the ukulele, violin and flute! Frances and Kim have used the keyboard, viola, trumpet, piccolo, clarinet, saxophone, trombone and euphonium to extend our students' experiences with instruments and learn about elements of musical notation, rhythm and parts of the orchestra.

While playing the ukuleles, Frances showed us how easy making songs can be, as well as how simple some tunes are. Students did lots of rhythmic and melodic dictation - our students were all absolutely fantastic at this! During the last session, Frances and Kim helped the students create a school song for Tooraweenah Public School. Frances also gave us a brief lesson on how to conduct an orchestra. Each day with Frances and Kim has been wonderful. Students always looked forward to the sessions and we hope to build on this great work next year. This initiative has been funded by the Minister's Arts Recovery Grant.

JE is a rare but serious disease spread to humans by mosquitoes carrying disease and has been on the rise across the state. NSW Health advise that the best protection is to avoid mosquito bites. To help our community The Education Department is distributing free mosquito repellent to our schools. Antiseptic spray / cream will also be distributed where infected bites has been raised as an issue.
