Arthur Butler Aviation Museum News

The past month has been spent assembling the information that is needed to make an application to the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) for permission to hold an event involving aeroplanes to which the Public is invited to attend as spectators. That has been sent away, and as soon as the fee is paid to look over the information (\$1600) they should give the event their tick of approval.

Also, the organisers have received quotes for the necessary risk insurance cover and for the provision of Port-a-Loos. One of the first improvements the Museum wanted for the aerodrome was a toilet block, which is essential for attracting visitors to the aerodrome to at least stop for a meal, and hopefully stay at one of the places of accommodation in Toora.

The organisers are going about seeking sponsorship money from various sources to be able to pay CASA, the Port-A-Loo people and insurers, and for sundries. They are also calling for local tinkers, tailors and candlestick makers, and anyone else who has a crafty little sideline to contact the organisers so that a space can be set aside for them to display and trade during the Event.

The aerodrome itself is getting a lot of attention, both for maintenance to keep the runway serviceable and the terminal area neat and tidy. As a result of this, and the promotion of the aerodrome to the aviation community, there has been an increase in aircraft movements associated with the aerodrome.

The word is spreading through the

recreational aviation community not only about the Event, but about Tooraweenah and its aerodrome.

The organisers need about fifty 20 litre chemical drums to use as boundary markers for the aerodrome and the area where the village fair will be held. So if farmers have an empty drum or two after spraying, could they drop them near the terminal building on the aerodrome, please?


