"Winging It Down The Castlereagh!" - Tooraweenah, You Did It!

Tooraweenah, you did it! 'Winging it Down the Castlereagh' was a resounding success, due in no small way to the support and efforts of the Tooraweenah community.

'Winging it Down the Castlereagh 'was devised to acknowledge the late Arthur Cecil Butlers' contribution to Aviation and in so doing, profile Tooraweenah's potential as a destination for short- and long-term stays.

The organising committee decided to direct its efforts towards attracting the people who fly small aeroplanes for recreation and holiday travel. On Saturday, May 20th thirty (30) light aircraft arrived on the historic Tooraweenah Aerodrome.

Spokes person Mark Adams said, "Those of you who know me, know that I've just landed here. Didn't know a thing about the place and its history. The first thing I saw as I came in to land was the picturesque

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village in the valley. The view took my breath away."

"And, when you add the grandeur of the Warrumbungles, the senses become overwhelmed." Thirty pilots and their passengers discovered this, as Mark did, when

he first landed. Thirty pilots and their passengers went home Saturday afternoon, to begin spreading the good news about Tooraweenah.

The success of the day did not only rest on the air event. The support given to the village fair by the many community groups and individual stallholders, really made the event a success. Mark was very pleased to learn that it had been worth it financially to them. He was especially pleased to see the local community groups – P&C, Lions and CWA - were able to make some much needed money to further their aims. The support of the Gilgandra unit of the SES to oversee the safety of everyone added to the high standard of the village fair.

The Mountain View Hotel, Caravan Park and Cross Roads Cabins also shared in the benefits brought by the event. It is acknowledged, these businesses are at the core of tourism in Tooraweenah and from here, who knows how things will develop.

Back in the day, Arthur Butler wanted to establish, what was known then by the

American term, a "dude ranch" to take advantage of Tooraweenah's holiday potential. Remember back to 2019 when a town meeting was held to discuss sustainability? To keep the Community updated, we have approached the Gilgandra Shire Council regarding the establishment of a Fuel Hub for Tooraweenah.

We have submitted a Development Application in relation to this important project. The Hub will be self serve to enable the Community to access both Diesel and Unleaded fuel. It will also have limited operating hours.

We have also employed a new Field Officer, David Amour, who will be available to you to source and sell livestock. We are also looking at selling boxed lamb

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that will be available through online sales through Tooraweenah Prime. We will keep you updated on all these projects.

Members have recently been involved in the Over the Hoof competition at the Dubbo Show, taking out some of the major prizes and helping raise money by donating lambs to the charity auction which raised \$40,000. 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Tooraweenah Preschool, 'Developing Wings of Independence' Marie Gale (Jacobsen)

Preschool friends have been loving Bush Preschool each week on alternate Wednesdays and Fridays. Balancing carefully along some logs has also tested us – especially if we have our drink bottle in one hand! Everyone has now mastered their



climbing skills when getting up the steep mountains and conquered our fears of slipping by remembering to walk sideways (like a goat) and place our feet sideways on the dirt as we climb.



We sure have established our 'running track' for going down! It has been really lovely seeing the children help each other and encourage one another as they balance and climb. We have also ventured in and along the creek, taking note of this environment closely. There was great excitement when several children found some yabby claws in the rocks on one visit. Children have been looking at the



water depth and the water grasses growing here. We've been making boats with sticks and leaves, watching them float along with the stream, and exploring the riverbank in general, again testing our new-found confidence with climbing.

Some preschool parents have also joined in the fun when they have accompanied us on our walks; for which we are most grateful. On our walks through the paddock, we've discovered some baby galahs and parrots nesting in the big trees near the 'swamp' we walk past. We've found various foot prints (cows and horses) and it's been interesting to check out how busy the native bees are at their hive at the base of a tree as we walk around it.

The giant ants' nests have also sparked our curiosity, with one friend informing us "They are all busy getting food for the Queen Ant and looking after her". Nature really is amazing! Friends have been enjoying our dress-ups, including some crazy animal outfits. One day we made a mobile phone at the craft table and then used them to call the zoo and let them know some of their animals had escaped to our preschool!

Some incredible art and craft masterpieces have been made and we have been learning about and practicing being kind and caring to each other, taking turns and sharing. (Puppet friends Kate, Jack and Anna from PALS: Playing and Learning to Socialise Program; have given us some tips.) Miss Shannon went shopping and brought lots of new tractors and farm equipment toys. We now have a large range of these vehicles, all of different makes and colours, with lots of smaller ones for inside play on our 'farm'. Everyone has loved using these along with the sheep yards, farm animals, our green paddocks and also a ploughed paddock (brown floor mat) at our busy preschool farm. Friends have been carting stock, shearing and drenching sheep, chasing the wild pigs away, feeding cattle and checking the chooks too; just as we have been with our real chooks that Miss Shannon brings in each day. Several good crops have been sown and some have even been harvested already as they were such good crops.



There are also some new tractors for the sandpit collection which have gone down a treat, with friends enjoying time outside together at the sandpit, riding the bikes together and lots of dramatic play around the fruit shop, with the babies and prams, and the picnic table at the sandpit. Our garden is growing, and many friends have been helping with pruning, watering, tidying up and caring for our plants.

We've seen some lovely butterflies fluttering around in our yard and also

watched some birds eating from our various bird feeders that we check and fill often.

Tim and Chris worked with Mrs Smith in her role as Digital Classroom Officer, before heading into the 1/2/4 classroom where Chris taught students how to use MakeCode Arcade to design and create their own game. Students created a maze and had a highly productive session.

Mark Pitts - Rugby 7s

May saw the first of 5 coaching sessions from Mark Pitts for 'Get into Rugby 7s.' Students practiced their passing skills, speed and agility. Coaching sessions are funded through a successful Term 2 Sporting Schools Grant.

During the most recent session, Mark Pitts helped students focus on passing, catching and touch football skills. They began with some skills focused games, and really worked on their catching and throwing skills as they played a fast-hands, fast feet crossover game. They moved on to hone their sprinting and try scoring skills and played a one-on-one game of touch. This proved to be much more difficult than anticipated and students had to really work hard to make sure they placed the football down correctly to score a try rather than throwing it over the touch line. Students then finished with a game of Seaweed and Octopi, which focused on lots of skills relevant to touch football like sprinting, sidestepping, endurance, and actually tagging an opponent. We can't wait for next week's session!

Earlier last week, Mrs Smith, Mrs Altmann and Mrs Jenkin have trained in several School Bytes modules (more over the coming weeks), Mrs Smith has completed some Digital Classroom Officer training and Mrs Jenkin attended the Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction Conference in Gilgandra.
