From The Dog House - with Brendan Butler

BODY LANGUAGE.

one of the first and most important drills that Gary White teaches is using our body language to manipulate and manoeuvre the dog we are training. Basically, body language is using our body presence to pressure the dog to go one way or another, get it to stop, and to change direction.

Young dogs especially feel threatened by us when we front up to them and stand over them, which is why we should always turn slightly, raise the pitch of our voice and get down to their level, relax and call them by name, to get them to come to us, but we can use this to our advantage to make them stop in a work or training situation by fronting fully up to them. If we want

the dog to go a particular way, we face At the recently held dog training school, our body behind where we want it to go give the command or whistle to go that direction then keep that position as we follow the dog around the sheep.

> To make it stop. We change our position to fully front up to the dog with a forceful command to stop, then to get it to go the other way we change our stance to behind the dog again to

pressure it to come back in that direction, a bit like trying to get a cow to go through a gate in the cattle yards, if we put our body pressure in front of the cow it will want to cut back but if we're pressuring it from behind it will be

happy to move forward through the gate to get away.

Body pressure when used with the appropriate commands is another handy tool in teaching our young four-legged work mates to naturally move around there stock calmly until they are competent and confident. Happy Mustering. Brendan Butler, **Oakfield Kelpies**


