Tooraweenah PA & H Association Inc has been made aware that the showground rodeo ground yards for stabled horses and other stock is not compliant with animal welfare standards and that stabling of horses with inadequate shelter for periods of more than 24hrs is an offence, Part 2 Section 8.3 Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1979, as amended.

It has therefore become necessary to notify users that their animals can no longer be kept in the existing yards and facilities for more than 24hrs.

The Committee regrets inconvenience that this causes to those users affected by these compliance matters. These issues cannot be fixed overnight, however, the Committee has resolved to be pro active and to source funding opportunities for the necessary infrastructure costs and expenses to ensure the showground facilities are upgraded and compliant with legal and animal welfare mandatory requirements.

There are also associated showground NLIS and DPIE stock movement notification requirements that will be advised in a further community notice.




