

ANZAC DAY 2025 Address 'The War Years'. Tooraweenah CWA —

Today is significant for Tooraweenah CWA members because it is our Birthday. 100 years ago today, April 25th 1925, a group of ladies got together and formed a branch of the Country Women's Association.

Initially their aim was to provide rest rooms for the women of the district. A place where they could meet, relax, develop friendships share knowledge and no doubt enjoy a cuppa.

With the backing of Mr. C. W. Rohr they were able to purchase the building in which the branch still meets.

The members soon became involved in holding fund-raising events such as Flower Shows, Wool Expos, catering and the ever popular Blue & Gold Balls to raise funds to support both local and national causes.

today some of the activities the CWA was involved in during the war years.

Despite the women undertaking greater work loads at home and having under this umbrella the CWA worked the constant worry of loved ones serving overseas; the CWA members under the guidance of their president, Mrs. Rose Sheldon, worked tirelessly to a watch as they left the district to 'joinsupport the War Effort in any practical way could.

The ladies busily tied and sewed together camouflage nets which were sent to Sydney and then overseas for

the army. Nationally the CWA produced over 150,000 nets saving the government money and manpower. Sheep skins were also collected and sent to be made into warm winter vests.

Everything possible was done to aid in the comfort of the Service men. The CWA members were kept busy knitting pullovers, scarves, balaclavas and socks the Tooraweenah Branch continues to all from home-spun wool. Flannel shirts offer help and a hand of Friendship to and pyjamas were sewn, fruit cakes baked, books and toiletries collected. All to be sent to the troops.

The local branch also supported 'The Snap-Shots From Home League' taking photos of local people and events to help connect the servicemen with their families during this time of great uncertainty and separation.

They supported 'The Australian Comforts Fund' raising £ 2. 12/-We have been asked to share with you annually to 'Adopt' a service man and help provide for his needs.

> A special 'War Workers Committee' was established in the village and with other local organisations. One of the committee's initiatives was to farewell and present each person with up'. Likewise, on their return, a special welcome home function was held.

Such occasions were tinged with a mixture of joyful celebrations and devastating sadness.

After peace was declared, the Branch continued their commitment to helping with the Post War Effort. Food hampers, tins of fat, clothing and donations were collected and sent to help with the Plight of Post-war Europe.

Our CWA motto contains the words 'Service to Country' and 100 years on wherever it is needed.

Later in the park a plaque will be unveiled to commemorate our 100 years. We thank the ANZAC committee for inviting us to share just a small part of our story with you this morning.


